#### Back to the Basics: Good Manners ~ Please Be Polite....

First catch on basic manners is having a foundation in some Basic Training Cues such as: Sit, Down, both Sit & Down Stay, and a Recall (a.k.a. Come).

You may ask why are the basics so important? In a nut shell it gives you options of asking for nice behaviors in place of those behaviors that drive you nuts! Remember safety while you train.

Changing our thought process comes in handy.... Instead of just reacting, think ahead and be proactive versus reactive.

Use your Management Tools like Crates, Exercise Pens, Leashes attached to the Dog and Leash in your Hand, have Treats out and ready to be in Training Mode.

Think how do I set my Puppy/Dog up for success to learn versus setting them up to fail.

#### For example what drives you crazy?

Door rushing? Barking at the doorbell? Door bolting and not coming back? Jumping on your our your Guests? Play Biting? House Training Accidents? Begging while you are eating dinner?

Once you have those behaviors in mind, think hmmmmm what are my options of an alternate behavior that would bring peace to my home? What can you do in advance to set them up for success vs. failure?

Instead of barking, jumping, and going nuts on your guests how being proactive before they arrive have a leash attached to your Puppy/Dog and be in

Management and Training mode! Reward nice behaviors like: focus on you, sits, downs.

Instead of running out the door ultimately create a solid sit or down stay on a bed away from the door anytime it is opened. Also, teach a Release Word (example: free, release, break), so there is no confusion on when he is released.

Use Management while Training so they have ZERO chance of practicing escaping and not coming back. We want them learning from you, not the environment.

Separate, take the time to work on a solid Recall (a.k.a. come or here) ultimately with distractions <u>and/or</u> an emergency/reliable recall, slowly one baby step at a time. Make it FUN!!!!

**First priority for demanding dogs** is to <u>make sure</u> you have honestly met his Mental Stimulation and Age Appropriate Physical Exercise Needs—a must!

During dinner time you can be in Training Mode — teach him to stay on his bed or other 'go to' place while you eat. Or be Proactive with Management and have him in an Exercise Pen or Crate combined with something interactive to keep him busy and calm with a Yummy pre-stuffed Kong Toy or West Paw Toppl that is Frozen with YUMMY Food/Treats or a Bully Stick in a Bully Buddy.

What about that throw my ball throw my ball or pet me pet me? Remember it is easy to accidentally reinforce behavior you do not want as easy is it is to

reward behavior you do want. Think about what you are reinforcing and teaching, be sure to stay consistent.

**Jumping? Reward an** incompatible behavior like a Sit or a Down.

**Basic Barking?** Teach a Speak <u>and</u> a Quiet Cue (think of it as an on and off switch).

**Frustration Barking?** Why is your Dog frustrated? Listen to your Dog.

Last but not least.... I realize we love our dogs, they are so cute and cuddly, but take the time to have them work for what they want most, as a fun way to get some easy Training Homework in (example: play, pets, toys, access to outside/inside or leash for a walk, treats, food bowl, etc.). How you ask? You initiate, ask them for a nice behavior like a Sit or a Down or Sit/ Down Stay, even a trick, then reward them with what they like or enjoy most....you will over time be amazed at how their listening skills and response times will begin to improve, and how much little time it takes to get in your Class Homework in mini sessions on and off throughout your day!

Off to Amazon.com I went and bought the wooden Turbo Dog Puzzle. This one slowed them down quite a bit, more frustrating, but kept their interest. The key is using small treats or it will jam.

Our newest puzzle purchase was the plastic Tornado. Found this puzzle in the middle of the two in difficulty and so far seems to be their favorite! Quite addicting for the dogs (although my cats haven't caught the bug yet).

Puzzles must be supervised at all times.
